## Submission Instructions

### SLATE

30–60 seconds

Begin your self-tape with a slate, recorded in a mid-shot (chest to top of head), directly facing the lens.

Please include:

- Full Name
- Age
- Height
- City & State
- Agency (if applicable)

End your slate with a quick full-body shot.

### AUDITION:

Perform your scene in a mid-shot with good lighting and clear audio. Record horizontally, and speak just to the left or right of the lens (not directly into it). Phones are acceptable, just ensure your image is in focus and your voice is clearly heard.

### UPLOAD & SUBMIT:

- Label your video: AMAZING GRACE VSL\_FirstLastName\_Role
- Upload to YouTube or Vimeo with privacy set to Unlisted
- After uploading, click submit or return back to the Casting Call Page within [www.withITVM.com](http://www.withITVM.com) and click the "Submit" button to submit your audition link.

### DEADLINE:

All video submissions must be received no later than November 1, 2025

Please follow all instructions carefully — incomplete submissions may not be considered.
